## Ontario youth apprenticeship program

The Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program offers students the opportunity to begin an apprenticeship while still in secondary school.

The program is funded by the Ministry of Training Colleges and Universities.

Students must be at least 16 years old and have completed 16 credits towards their OSSD.

- Students in a Cooperative Education placement in an apprenticeable trade are considered OYAP students.
- Students may be signed as an apprentice while at their Co-op placement.
